might God do make my last will and Testament & bequeathing all that I have in man-
ner and form following first I commend my soules to the hands of Almighty God my
Maker and Redeemer and my bodie to Christian buriall and as for my worldly goods & effects
of them as followeth first I give and bequeath to Edward ap Ellis the summe of ten shillings
of Current English money Alsd I give and bequeath to Elizabeth ap Ellis the like summe of ten
shillings Alsd I give and bequeath to John Evan the summe two shillings Alsd I give and bequeath
to Elizabeth ap Evan the like summe of two shillings Alsd I give and bequeath unto Robert ap
the summe of twenty shillings Alsd I give and bequeath all the rest of my goods both moveable
and immovable & all bill and chattell bills bonds monyes of what sort soever and all other
things whosoever to be longed to husbandrie & to my wife's use in Christ William ap Ellis of
ap Owen and Owen Griffith to pay my sayd legacies & debts to discharge my funerall expences
Alsd I do nominate appoint constitute and ordaine the said William ap Ellis and Owen
Griffith to be Executors of this my last will and Testament In witness whereof I have
put to this my last will and Testament my hand and seal in the presence of the persons
whose names are subscribed & the mark of the said Griffith John Griffith ap David
Simon ap Richard Ellis David John Ellis John Jones

was proved at London before the Judges for probate of wills and granting of Admin-
istrations of the twenty fifth day of May in the year of our Lord God one thousand six hundred and fifty nyne
by the oath of William ap Ellis and Owen Griffith Executors named in the sayd will & of home

On the day of February Anno Domini one thousand six hundred and fifty eight of Henry Huffam
in the parish of Preston in the County of Kent a good man though somewhat of old age of
good and perfect memory the Lord be praised for it and for all his mercies and favours
bestowed upon me from time to time I do make and ordaine this my last will and Testa-
ment in manner and form following: First I bequeath my soules into the hands of Al-
mighty God assuring my selfe by the death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ to have full
pardon and forgiveness of all my sinnes and by no other meanes and my soules to the will
Everlasting life And my bodie I commit to the Earth from whence it was taken to be
decently buried within the Churchyard of the parish Church of St. Peter ad Vincula
And as for my worldly goods that God hath lent me here in this life I give them as
followeth first I will and give unto my sonne Henry Huffam two hundred pounds of
Current English money and hundred pounds of which he the said Henry hath
given me bond for my will and meaning is that the said bond shall be delivered in
unto him within one month next after my decease And the other hundred pounds my will
and meaning is shall be paid unto him within one year next after my decease by my Ex-
ecutor hereafter named Item I will and give unto my sonne Richard Huffam one hundred
pounds of this lawfull English money to be paid unto him within the first year next after my
decease by my Executor hereafter named Item I will and give unto my daughter Elizabeth
the wife of Steven Woodland five pounds to be paid unto her within six months next after
my

my decease by my Executor hereafter named from my will and give unto my daughter Sarah the
 wife of William Gardie thirty poundes of like lawfull English mony to be paid unto her
 within thre monethes next after my decease by my Executor hereafter named, which
 sayd summe of thirty poundes is in the hande of the sayd William Gardie from my will and
 give unto my daughter Margaret Johnson twenty poundes of like lawfull English mony to be
 paid unto her within thre monethes next after my decease by my Executor hereafter
 named from my will and give unto my daughter Emme Guffam sixtore poundes of like law-
 full English mony to be paid unto within thre monethes next after my decease by
 my Executor hereafter named from my will and give unto the sayd Emme my
 daughter one bedsteall with the bedding, all the furniture therunto belonging standing
 in the great lottse to be delivred unto her within one moneth next after my decease by
 my Executor hereafter named from my will and give unto the thre daughters of Steven
 Woodlary namely Mary, Margaret and Sarah unto each of them five poundes apiece
 to be paid unto them when they shall attayne their severall ages of one and twenty
 yeres or at their day of marriage whith of them shall first happen, it to come from my
 will is that if either of thes six shall depart this life before they shall accomplish
 their severall ages as aforesayd from my will and giveing is that her or
 their parts so dyinge shall remaine and be paid unto her or them which shall be then
 alive by my Executor hereafter named from my will and give unto Mary the daughter of
 Andrew Glynstree five poundes of like lawfull English mony to be paid unto her when
 she shall attayne the age of one and twenty yeres or at her day of marriage whith
 of them shall first happen for to come by my Executor hereafter named from all the
 residue of my moveable goods whatsoever he or she shall have in this my Will
 Dattell and Whattell bills and bondes and ready monyes whatsoever shall be myne
 at the day of my death after my debts are paid, my Creditors which my executor
 executer and the probate of this my Will discharge from my will and giveing unto my
 some Magradall Guffam whom I do make and appoint to be my heire and sole
 executor of this my Testament and last Will **This is the last Will**
 and Testament of me Henry Guffam of Weston in the County of Kent woman as aforesayd
 made and declared the day and yere first above written of all my houses and landes
 orchards and gardenes with all and singuler the buildings edifices and hereditaments
 therunto belonging situate lyinge and being in the parishes of Minster in the
 Isle of Thanet and Ash next Sandwith in the County of Kent aforesayd from my will
 give and bequeath unto my sonne Michall Guffam all my landes lying within the
 parish of Ash next Sandwith to him and his heyres for ever upon Condition that
 he the sayd Michall Guffam his heyres and Assignes shall pay unto my sinner
 Mary Paromore twen shillings a yere for and during the term of her naturall
 life in manner and forme followinge that is to saye at two severall tymes
 in the yere at the ende of every sixe monethes five shillings and the first payment
 of five shillings to be made and paid the xxvj day sixe monethes next after my
 decease and so every sixe monethes after five shillings for and during the term
 of her naturall life as aforesayd from my will give and bequeath unto my sonne
 Richard Guffam all my houses and landes orchards and gardenes with all and singuler
 the buildings edifices and hereditaments therunto belonging lying and being
 in Minster in the Isle of Thanet and County of Kent aforesayd unto him and
 his heyres for ever upon Condition that he the sayd Richard Guffam his heyres
 and Assignes shall well and truly pay unto my daughter Emme Guffam three
 poundes a yere in manner and forme followinge that is to saye at two severall
 tymes in the yere at the ende of every sixe monethes thirty shillings
 and the first payment of thirty shillings to be made and paid the xxvj day
 sixe monethes next after my decease and so every sixe monethes after thirty
 shillings for and during the term of her naturall life And further my will
 and
