One hundred Pounds of lawful British Money to be paid to me in four quarterly payments viz on the twenty fifth day of March the twenty fourth day of June the twenty ninth day of September and the twenty fifth day of December in every year the first payment thereof to be made upon such of the said days as shall first happen next after my decease and I will that the said Annuity shall be free of all outgoings of any kind and I will also or that she may have and her heirs and assigns shall be a proper discharge and charge my two freehold Tenors to wit No 137 c 138 in Aldersgate Street with the payment of the said Annuity and I give unto my said Sister the same powers of Justice and entry for recovery of the said Annuity in case the same shall be in arrear and unpaid as she would be entitled to by Law for recovery of such in arrear & also give and bequeath the following Legacies to wit to my dear Brother Henry Brougham of Tottenham Street Surinon one thousand Pounds and if my said Brother shall depart this life before he shall receive the said Legacy of one thousand Pounds I direct the same to be divided equally between such of his Children as shall be then living next and I further give unto my said Brothers Children to wit to Josias Brougham to Amelia Brougham to Eliza Brougham and to Ralph Brougham their hundred Pounds each and to Henry Brougham Junior five hundred Pounds to Robert Barry Sparks of St John Street Middlesex five hundred Pounds to his late wife Ann Sparks three thousand Pounds to William Ward one of my Journeymen five hundred Pounds to John Whalley of Finsbury Square Doctor of Physic one hundred Pounds to Mary Royce to Samuel Taylor and to Sophia his wife to Sarah Whalley to Thomas Sparks the Elder and to Robert Barry Sparks and to John Sparks his wife five hundred Pounds each for a Ring as a small token of my affectionate regard for them to Solomon Royce Junior and to his Sister Lydia Sanjour one hundred Pounds each to John East Dix if he shall be living in my partnership at the time of my decease one thousand Pounds to Aldersgate Ward Charity School one hundred Pounds to the General Dispensary in Aldersgate Street fifty Pounds to twelve poor widows living in the Parish of St Botolph Aldersgate three Pounds each to William Climmer if living in my service in Aldersgate Street one hundred Pounds to each of my Journeymen of seven years standing and upwards who at the time of my decease shall work in my factory in Aldersgate Street five Shillings and to each of those under seven years standing two Shillings to each of my God Children nineteen Shillings to each of my domestic servants in Charter House Square six pence mourning and further to Mary Brown for her long and faithful service sixty Pounds to Eleanor Robinson nineteen Shillings to Jonathan Crow thirty Pounds and lastly give and devise all my freehold Estate to wit my two Tenors No 137 c No 138 in Aldersgate Street also my leasehold Estate in the Court adjoining to my said freehold Estate in Aldersgate Street also my leasehold dwelling Tenor No 19 in Charter House Square also my leasehold Tenor in Grove Lane Cambridge and all the rest and residue of my estate and effects both real and personal whatsoever and whosoever subject to the aforesaid Annuity and testamentary bequests unto my Nephew Solomon Royce the Elder of Aldersgate Street London Goldsmith his Executors Administrators and Assigns and I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint the aforesaid John Whalley and the aforesaid Solomon Royce the Elder Executors of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking and making void all former and other will and wills by me at any time heretofore made and I do declare this to be my last will and Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty third day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighteen Solomon Brougham Esq and signed sealed published and declared by the within named Testator Solomon Brougham as and for his last will and Testament in the presence of us who have hereunto subscribed our names as witnesses hereunto at his request in his presence and in the presence of each other George Frederic Blogg James Edward Blogg Aldersgate Street Henry Piper 79 Little Britain

NB All the Stock which at my death shall stand in my name as Treasurer of the General Dispensary in the name for not reduced Bank Annuities is the Property of the said General Dispensary and I direct the same to be immediately transferred into such names in Trust for that Charity as the Committee shall appoint dated 23rd Feb^{ry} 1818, Solomon Brougham

Appeared personally John East Dix of Aldersgate Street London Goldsmith and Richard Smith of Drury Lane Street London Gentleman and made oath that they know and were acquainted with Solomon Douglass late of Charter House Square London Merchant deceased for sometime before and to the period of his death and have several times seen him write and write and subscribed his name to writings whereby they have acquired a knowledge of his manner and character of handwriting and subscription and having now viewed the paper writing purporting to be and contain a Codicil to his last will and Testament of the said Decedent the said Codicil beginning thus "I do hereby all the stock which at my death shall stand in my name" ending thus "as the Committee of Executors pay that they write and in their consciences believe the name 'Solomon Douglass' set out and subscribed thereto to have been written and subscribed by and with the proper hand of the said Solomon Douglass deceased. John East Dix Richard Smith Same day the said John East Dix and Richard Smith were duly sworn to the truth of this Affidavit before me a Parson Sur. Jurant Tho. Blake Not Pub

Proved at London with a Codicil 27 August 1818 before the worshipful Samuel Peare Parson D. of Laws and Sur by the Oaths of John Yelloly and Solomon Doyne the said the Executors to whom Admon was granted having been first sworn duly to administer.

This is the last Will and Testament of me Magdalen Dolford (wife of Josiah Dolford Esquire) of Dampstead in the County of Middlesex who was John Smith late of the Parish of Saint Dunstons London Esquire deceased in and by his last will and Testament bearing in writing bearing date the twenty first day of June one thousand seven hundred and seventy nine did give and bequeath all the net residue and remainder of his Estate and Effects to certain Trustees in his said will named in Trust to place the same in Government Securities and pay the Dividends and interest thereof to my said husband Josiah Dolford and to me the said Magdalen Dolford during her life and from and after the death of the survivor of us Upon Trust to assign and transfer all the said net residue and remainder of his Estate and Effects and the stocks funds and Securities in or upon which the same or any part thereof should be then placed out or invested and the interest and produce thereof unto and amongst such Child or Children of me the said Magdalen Dolford by the said Josiah Dolford Esquire my husband or the issue of any such Child or Children in such shares parts and proportions manner and form as the said Magdalen Dolford by any deed or writing or wills (notwithstanding any Statute) should direct limit or appoint and for default of such direction limitation or appointment then equally amongst all my Children living at my death and who was my eldest son John Josiah Dolford on his Marriage with my daughter Charlotte Dolford as aforesaid I did on the Marriage of my daughter Charlotte Dolford with Sir John Oliver her present husband by a certain indenture or deed of appointment bearing date on or about the twentieth day of March 1794 assign and appoint unto her the said Charlotte Oliver (then Dolford) and her issue the sum of five thousand pounds of lawful Money of Great Britain after the death of me and my said husband being part of the said residue of the Estate and Effects of the said John Smith Esquire deceased now I do hereby ratify and confirm the said indenture or deed of appointment and all and every the Clauses therein contained and was in further pursuance of the powers given to and vested in me as aforesaid I did on the Marriage of my son Charles Dolford with Mary Roberts his present wife by another certain indenture or deed of appointment bearing date on or about the fourth day of December now last past assign and appoint unto him the said Charles Dolford and his issue the like sum of five thousand pounds of lawful Money of Great Britain after the death of me and my said husband being further part of the said residue of the Estate and Effects of the said John Smith Esquire deceased now I do hereby ratify and confirm the said indenture or deed of appointment and all and every the Clauses therein contained and in further pursuance of the powers enabling me thereto as aforesaid I the said Magdalen Dolford by this my will
