George Whiting of 20th Duke Street London Bridge in the County of Surrey Gentleman and made oath that he is one of the subscribed and witnessed to the last Will and Testament of Joseph Haffam late of Provident Place Colchester in the County of Essex Gentleman deceased bearing date the twenty fourth day of July one in the thousand eight hundred and forty one now hereto annexed and he further made oath that on the twenty fourth day of July aforesaid the said testator duly executed his said Will by signing his name at the foot or end thereof in the presence of the said deponent and of Mary King Spinster the other subscribed and witnessed thereto both of whom were present at the same time and the said deponent and the said Mary King thereupon in and about the said day of August 1843 the said George Whiting was sworn to the truth of his Affidavit before me - *John Daubeny Junr; Pres.
