This my last will and Testament in manner following -
 That is to say first I committed my soul to God that
 gave it and my Body I commit to the Earth or Sea as it
 shall please God to order and as for and concerning
 in my worldly Estate I give bequeath and dispose
 thereof as followeth that is to say all Tithes Sum and
 Sum of Money Lands Tenements Goods Chattels and
 Estate whatsoever as shall be any way due owing or
 belonging unto me at the time of my Decease I do give
 devise and bequeath the same unto my beloved wife
 Eleanor Dury of the County of Down in the County of
 Carrickfergus and I do hereby nominate and appoint
 my beloved wife Eleanor Dury sole executrix of this my
 last will and Testament hereby revoking all former
 and other wills Testaments and Gifts of Gifts by me
 at any time heretofore made and I do ordain and
 ratify these presents to stand and be for and as my
 only last will and Testament In witness whereof to
 this my said will I have set my hand and seal the
 thirtieth day of April in the year of our Lord
 one thousand seven hundred and seventy nine and in
 the ninth year of the reign of his Majesty King
 George the Third over Great Britain &c. In witness
 whereof I have signed sealed published and
 decreed in the presence of Wm Walker, Jno Carney?

This Will was proved at London the twenty sixth
 day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand
 seven hundred and eighty three before the Right
 worshipful Peter Calvert Doctor of Laws Master
 Keeper or Commissary of the Prerogative Court of
 Canterbury lawfully constituted by the oath of Eleanor
 Dury widow the Executrix of the deceased and sole executrix
 named in the said will to whom administration of all
 and singular the Goods Chattels and Credits of the said
 deceased was granted his having been first sworn by
 Commission duly to administer &c.

In the Name of God Amen
 I Sarah Hougham of the County of London widow
 do make this my last will and Testament in manner
 following that is to say I give and devise to my eldest
 son Charles Hougham his heirs and assigns for ever
 all my freehold messuages Lands Tenements and
 hereditaments situate in East Gate Worcester in the
 County of Hereford I give devise and bequeath all the
 Rest Residue and Remainder of my Estates both Real
 and Personal of what nature kind or quality soever
 the same shall be unto my said son Charles Hougham

and my youngest Son George Hougham their Executors Administrators and Assigns to be equally divided between them share and share alike to live as tenants in common and not as joint tenants and I do nominate and appoint Mr. Hainsey Alchome of the Tower of London Gentleman and my said two Sons Charles Hougham and George Hougham Executors of this my will hereby revoking all former wills by me made in witness whereof I the said Sarah Hougham, the Testatrix have hereunto set my hand and seal this nineteenth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty one, Sarah Hougham signed sealed published and declared by the Testatrix Sarah Hougham as and for her last will and Testament in the presence of us who in her presence and at her request have subscribed our names in witness

This I mean as a Codicil to my former will and desire is that in case my Sister Elizabeth Phillips widow be living at the time of my death that my two Sons who are my Executors do pay unto the said Elizabeth Phillips the sum of ten pounds of good and lawfull money of Great Britain within a month after my decease being my legacy and I likewise bequeath unto my said Sister my black sattin and as to my Linnen which is called wearing apparel I desire it may be equally divided between the aforesaid Mrs. Phillips and my Son George Hougham's wife named Sarah Hougham
whereunto I set my hand and seal this seventh day of September one thousand seven hundred and eighty two

appeared personally Samuel March of Saint Dunstons Hill London Gentleman and Hainsey Alchome of the Tower of London Gentleman and made oath that they know and were well acquainted with Sarah Hougham formerly of the Liberty of the Tower but late of the Tower of London widow deceased for many years before and to the time of her death and having seen her write and write and subscribe her name and are thereby become well acquainted with her manner and character of handwriting and subscription and having now carefully viewed the paper writing thereto annexed being a codicil to the last will and Testament of the said deceased beginning thus "This I mean as a Codicil to my former will" and ending thus "whereunto I set my hand and seal this seventh day of September one thousand seven hundred

and eighty two" and thus subscribed "Sarah Doughtam"
They say they verily and their consciences believe the
said Series and Contents of the said paper writing
and the subscription thereto to be all of the proper
handwriting and subscription of the said Sarah
deceased, Jan. March, J. Ashorne the said
James Hazell and Stainsby Ashorne were duly sworn
to the truth of the ^{above} Affidavit before me and Justice
James Surrogate, Pres. W. Black Dot. Publ.

This Will was proved at London with a Codicil the
twenty sixth day of March in the year of our Lord one
thousand seven hundred and eighty three before the
respected Andrew Colles Surrogate Doctor of Laws Surrogate
of the Right worshipful Peter Calvert Doctor of Laws Master
Magistrate or Commissioner of the Prerogative Court of Canterbury
lawfully constituted by the Oath of Stainsby Ashorne one of
the Executors named in the said Will to whom Administration
of all and singular the Goods Chattels and Credits of the
deceased was granted he having been first sworn duly
to administer Power reserved of making the like Grant
to Charles Doughtam and George Doughtam the Sons of
the deceased and the other Executors named in the said
Will which ~~will~~ they or either of them shall apply
for the same.

This is the last Will and Testament
of me Anthony Hedges of Bocking in the County of
Essex Esquire whereas my late father Anthony
Hedges Esquire deceased in and by his last will and Testament
bearing date on or about the eighteenth day of February
which was in the year of our Lord one thousand seven
hundred and fifty seven directed that I should have
full power to charge all his the said Testator's Real
Estate whatsoever therein devised to me for the term of
my natural life with the Sum of one hundred pounds
a year Sterling Money of Great Britain for a
provision for my dear wife Elizabeth Hedges in case
she shall survive me during her life or during her
widowhood as I should think fit by equal half yearly
payments clear of all deductions and which the
said Anthony Hedges deceased by a Codicil to his said
last will and Testament bearing date ~~on or~~
~~about~~ the fifteenth day of July in the ^{year} ~~year~~
~~one thousand seven hundred and fifty seven~~ gave
me full power to charge all my said Estate with the
further Sum of one hundred pounds a year more for
the uses aforesaid I do therefore in execution of the
said Powers charge and subject all the Real Estate
