 saith that the subscription "W. Esauwrit" set and  
 subscribed to the said Will is to the best of his  
 knowledge and belief of the proper handwriting of the

 Attestal Clerts was duly sworn to the truth of  
 this Affidavit before me. William Battin Surrogat pres.  
 Sec. of the Not. Pub.

This Will was proved at London the eighte  
 day of December in the year of Our Lord 1709  
 thousand seven hundred and eighty nine before the  
 worshipfull William Battin Doctor of Laws Surrogat of  
 the Right honorable Sir William Wynne Knight Doctor  
 of Laws Master Keeper or Commissary of the Prerogative  
 Court of Canterbury lawfully constituted by the Oath of  
 Elizabeth Esauwrit widow the Relict of the Deceased and  
 sole Exectrix named in the said Will to whom  
 Administration was granted of all and singular the  
 Goods Chattels and Credits of the said Deceased having  
 been first sworn duly to administer

This is the last Will  
 and Testament of me Mary Esougham of the City of  
 Canterbury widow first I do hereby order and direct  
 my Exectors herein after named immediately after  
 my Decease to pay unto William Esougham of the  
 Parish of Saint Paul in the County of Kent  
 Esquire all such Sum and Sums of Money as I  
 may owe and stand indebted unto him at the  
 time of my Decease he having generously offered to  
 advance and lend me Money for and towards  
 my support and maintenance And from and  
 immediately after payment thereof and of all other  
 my Debts and funeral Expences and the Charges of  
 proving this my Will and all other incident Charges  
 I give and bequeath all and every my Goods &  
 Chattels Effects Debts due and owing unto me

 written at my hand and seal this eighteenth  
 day of January in the twenty fifth year of the  
 reign of our Sovereign Lord George the third now  
 King of Great Britain of and in the year of our  
 said our thousand seven hundred and eighty five.  
 Mary Esq. daughter of George Esq. deceased and  
 sealed by the said Mary Esq. daughter  
 as and for her last Will and Testament in the  
 presence of us John Cumming, Esq. Cumming.

This Will was proved at London the twelfth  
 day of December in the year of our Lord our  
 thousand seven hundred and eighty five before the  
 worshipful George Esq. Doctor of Laws surrogate  
 of the Right Honourable Sir William Wynne Esq. Doctor  
 of Laws Master Serjeant or Commissioner of the  
 prerogative Court of Canterbury lawfully constituted  
 by the oath of Staunby the said Staunby although  
 the said Executor named in the said Will to  
 whose administration was granted of all and  
 singular the Goods Chattels and Credits of the said  
 deceased having been first sworn duly to administer.
